


SNACK BAR UPDATES By Mike Hodes

The Clubhouse International Standards consist of 37 principles that define the Clubhouse model for all Clubhouses around the world. They are the basis for how Clubhouse programs are assessed and serve as a "bill of rights" for members and a guidebook for how a Clubhouse is to operate.

The Seventh Standard:

The Clubhouse provides an effective reach out system to members who are not attending, becoming isolated in the community or hospitalized.

Reach out is a vital aspect of the Clubhouse program. It shows members that they are cared about, that they are a needed and wanted member of the community, and that they are missed when they aren't here. As someone with a mental illness, this is very important, to know that someone would miss you, that someone DOES MISS YOU, when you aren't here.

Mike H. agrees that reach out is important and says that we need to do more of it.

Our Clubhouse currently makes routine reach out via phone calls to all new members and to people who we haven't seen in the last week. We also reach out to members to notify them about special events. These calls are recorded in a binder which is kept at the front desk.

In order to be on the reach out list you need to complete a reach out survey, which you should have received in the mail and is also available at the reception desk.

Wendell, who receives routine reach out, says that reach out phone calls make him feel connected and a part of the Clubhouse community, even when he hasn't been in for a while.

Reach out can make a huge difference when people are personally invited to come into the Clubhouse. For example, after Barb called people to remind them about yoga, we had such a huge turnout for Jesse's class that we ran out of yoga mats.

I will attest that a reach out phone call is appreciated even by someone who DOES attend regularly. It brings tears of joy to my eyes just thinking about how last year, as an 11 year member, I received a call to wish me a "Happy Birthday" on my birthday. I felt so special and loved by my Clubhouse community.

And that's what the Clubhouse is, a community. To keep our community strong, we must keep reaching out and drawing people back.




