

Clubhouse International Standard #11 By Delaine Swearman

The Clubhouse International Standards consist of 37 principles that define the Clubhouse model for all Clubhouses around the world. They are the basis for how Clubhouse programs are assessed and serve as a "bill of rights" for members and a guidebook for how a Clubhouse is to operate.

The Eleventh Standard:

Responsibility for the operation of the Clubhouse lies with the members and staff and ultimately with the Clubhouse director. Central to this responsibility is the engagement of members and staff in all aspects of Clubhouse operation.

A good Clubhouse operates like a well-oiled machine. People are welcomed, lunch is made, phones are answered, newsletter articles are written, the floor is swept, and so forth. The Clubhouse machine can only work with the collaborative efforts of members and staff, and with the involvement and oversight of a dedicated director.

It is the director who creates the urgency and excitement, who sets an example by involving members in tasks, and who holds the staff accountable to engaging with members in Clubhouse opportunities.

As we have all seen, when excitement and positive energy starts with the director, it quickly trickles down into the rest of the community. A good director brings a Clubhouse to life!

My Work as a Cat Cuddler By: Pohla Smith

My husband, Evan Pattack, and I have a beautiful black and tan coonhound named Daphne and four wonderful cats named Steed, Mrs. Peel, Buff and Sophia. On thursdays, however, I have up to 140 cats and kittens to care for.

That's because I'm one of more than 300 volunteers who help take care of homeless animals at Humane Animal Rescue of Pittsburgh (HARP). My official title is Cat Cuddler.

HARP has three separate facilities—one on the North Side, another in the East End and a third in Rosedale. I work at the East End Center, which operates ina relatively new building on Hamilton Avenue, about 2 miles away from where Evan and I live in Pittsburgh's Park Place neighborhood.

There we get assigned to work 2 hours every week. We are limited to having no more than 4 people in a group. My group usually consists of just the 2 of us. We have a good team to into the big rooms that usually have a single car, although there can be as many as 4.

We pet them, give them treats, and make sure they have enough water and regular food.

We try to stay current on which cats and kittens have been adopted. My partner and I feel bad for those that have been living at the shelter for weeks and months, but we keep them as happy as possible. Other volunteers and staff members do too!

BARGAIN BIN RECORD REVIEWS FOR FEBRUARY 2023

I haven't written about Elvis Costello for many years. The last time was in 2006 when I did a 3-part review about his early work. A lot has happened in the intervening years. The big one was the break up of his backing band-the Attractions. They were replaced by a similar group called "The Imposters." They have backed Costello for several years.

The Imposters were on his album with Allen Toussaint, *The River Runs in Reverse*. This CD is an interesting effort by Costello to popularize Toussaint's music. Costello sings the main lyrics while Toussaint palsy organ and sings backing vocals. It is a noble effort, but not as important as Costello's earlier work.

The Imposters also play on Costello's CD *Smile and When I Was Cruel*. Their similarity to The Attractions is obvious on these CDs. This is because The Imposters are two-thirds of The Attractions. The biggest difference is that David Faragher replaces Bruce Thomas on the bass. Steve Nieve plays more types of keyboards for The Imposters than he did in The Attractions. Pete Thomas is still on the drums.

Finally, there is the *Delivery Man*. This CD features rock, pop, and country songs. It intertwines 3 stories and as such is somewhat confusing. The Imposters play a key role in the songs, and on the surface, it is a good CD. I wish that the songs were not so confusing.

So there you have it. Despite being the same band as The Attractions, The Imposters come across as very different. Costello has grown a great deal from the days of "This Year's Model." I suggest that you get one of those CDs and listen to it carefully.






Mae Jemison (1956 -)

Meet Punxsutawney Phil: Mr. Phil if you're nasty



Phil's full name is a mouthful. The groundhog's name is Punxsutawney Phil, Seer of Seers, Sage of Sages, Prognosticator of Prognosticators and Weather Prophet Extraordinary.

Phil is fat. Punxsutawney Phil weighs about 20 pounds and is 22 inches long, while the average groundhog weighs 12-15 pounds and is 20 inches long.

Phil is one old groundhog. Phil is 127 years old, supposedly. The average groundhog lives to be between 6-8 years, but Phil takes a magical elixir every summer to extend his lifespan. The elixir also changes his appearance (much like the Doctor in "Doctor Who"), which explains why Phil may be grey one year and a youthful brown the next. Alas, the elixir does not work on humans. "We've tried, it just makes them fat and bald," said Ron Ploucha, Stump Warden of the Inner Circle of the Groundhog Club and co-handler of Phil. "If you saw some of our Inner Circle members you can tell the ones that tried."

Phil has a wife. Well, make that Phil has had many wives. While Phil has an extended lifespan, his wives do not partake in the elixir so they pass away like normal groundhogs do. Phil always finds love again, though. "He's probably had more wives than Hugh Hefner." Ploucha said. Phil's current wife is called Phyllis - of course.

Phil does not have kids. While there is nothing wrong with Phil reproductively (we asked), Phil has no children - he and his wife decided they are really too busy to raise a family. But that doesn't mean he does not love kids. "He considers everybody his kids, being 127 years old," Ploucha said.

Phil was not in "Groundhog Day." Phil had a full schedule and was not able to partake in the filming of the movie. In the Bill Murray movie he is played by a groundhog named Scooter - who bit the actor three times during filming. Phil was Murray's first choice for the role. "He's treated like royalty and is very well-behaved. A true professional," the actor told The Philadelphia Inquirer in 1993. "So when they couldn't get him - a creature who has been hand-raised since birth and is very tame - what did they do? They went out into the woods and caught this Scooter, a groundhog who hated my guts from day one."

Phil loves granola bars. Oat and honey granola bars are Phil's favorite food, according to Ploucha - in particular Nature Valley ones.

Phil has his own car. It's called the Philmobile and it's little bus that houses members of the Inner Circle. Phil has a special seat on the outside, so he can be seen on parades.

Phil plays dead, occasionally. Oftentimes during summer parades, crowds will panic as the Philmobile draws through. That's because they will see Phil lying flat on his back, legs in the air looking dead. But he isn't, this is just how groundhogs cool off, according to Ploucha. One tap on the glass and Phil turns himself the right way round again.
